### Dear All

As a result, bearing in mind current guidelines and our detailed Risk Assessments, the school has now reached full capacity. Unfortunately, therefore, we are unable to open school to wider year groups including Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. Going forward any additional keyworkers requesting places at school will be placed on a waiting list.

We love hearing from you and seeing what you have been doing. Remember that you can send photos on the ClassDojo or via our class Twitter feed.



- Will's homemade Father's Day card


This week year 5 have been busy:
